He was born on February 8th, 1932 in Queens, New York. When he was 20, he joined the Air Force and wrote music for their band.

After the Air Force, John studied music at Julliard and Eastman. After graduating, he wrote music for small films and TV shows.

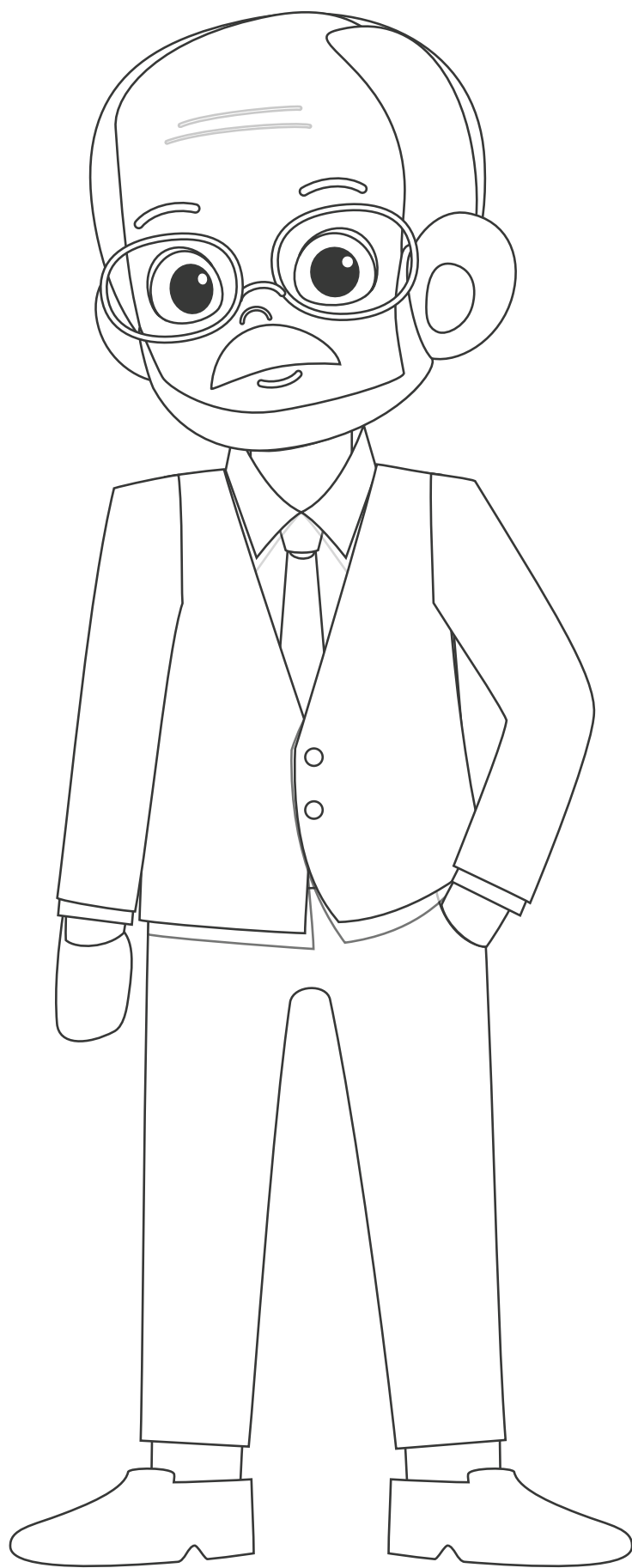
After years of composing for small movies and TV shows, he began working with famous directors like Steven Spielberg and George Lucas.

Through movies like Jaws, Star Wars, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, and E.T., audiences became familiar with John Williams beautiful neoromantic style.

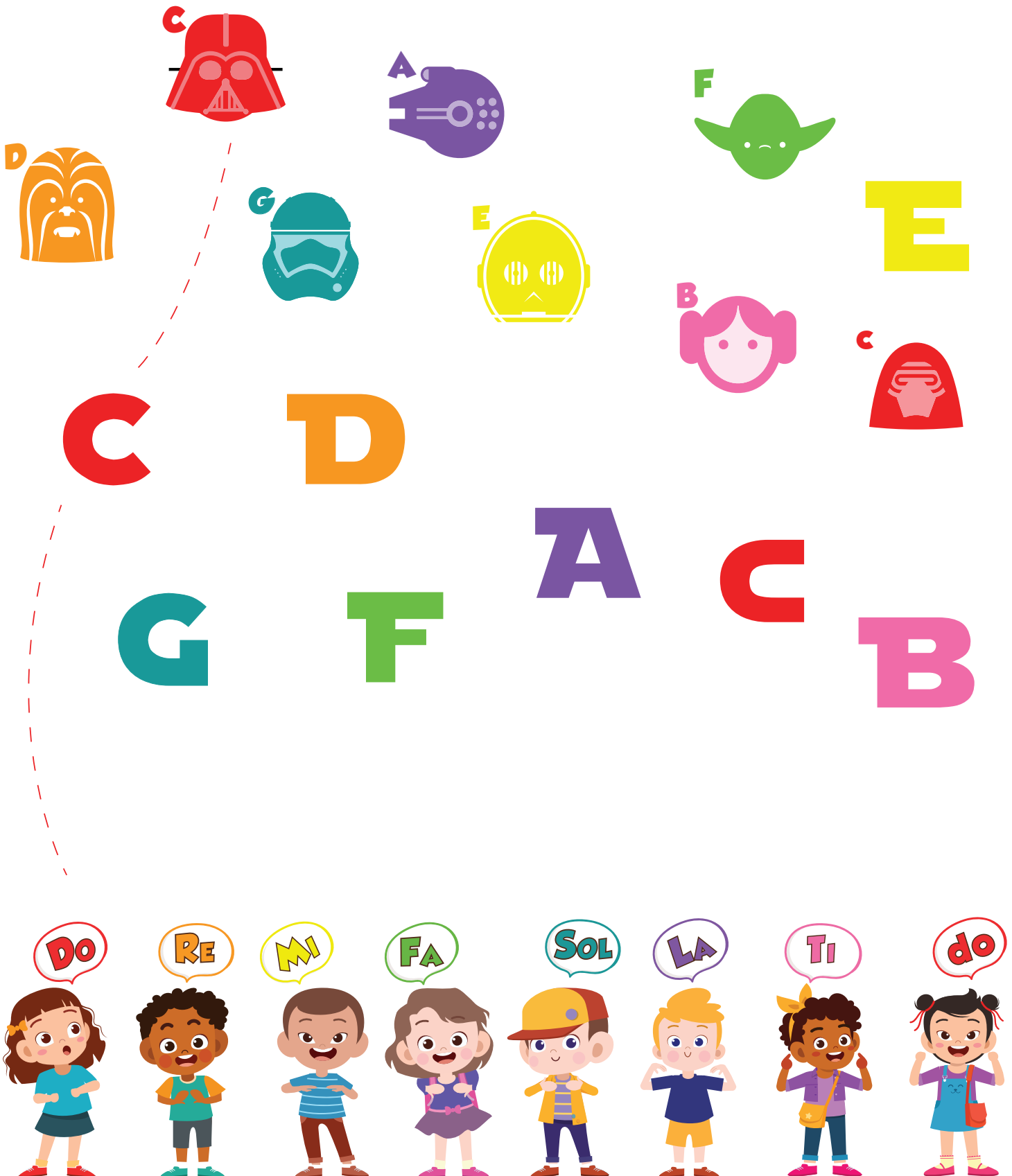
His career spans seven decades, he has won dozens of awards, and his music has touched the hearts of millions.

The next time you watch X-Wings and Tie Fighters fight an epic space battle, try turning off the sound. You'll quickly see how important John's music is to making the action feel real.



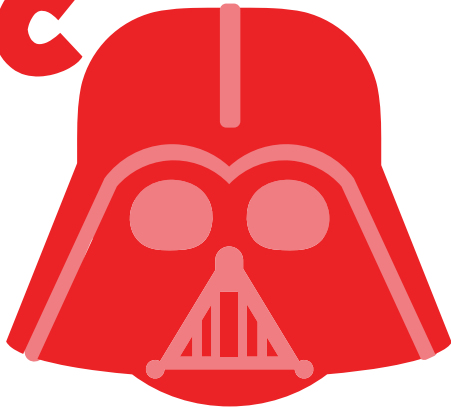
